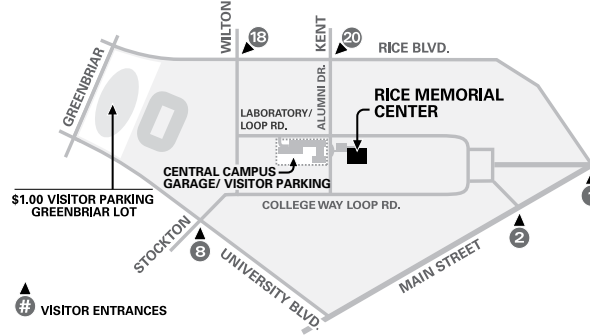

GUEST TEACHER: GEOFFREY SELLING

Geoffrey began Scottish country dancing while a junior at Swarthmore College in 1969. He passed his Preliminary exam the following summer at St. Andrews and completed the Teachers' Certificate in 1974. Since 1969, he has taught all levels of classes and has danced continuously in the Delaware Valley Branch. He has been teacher candidate Tutor for the Branch and the TAC Summer School. In 1998 Geoffrey was appointed a RSCDS teacher candidate Examiner. He is a regular staff member at the RSCDS Summer School in St. Andrews, Scotland and also teaches weekends, master classes, workshops and day schools around the US, Canada, Japan and the UK.

Geoffrey and his wife, Cecily, wrote the *Handbook for Scottish Country Dance Teachers*. He is also the author of numerous articles in TACTALK and the RSCDS's annual bulletin.

A retired elementary school science teacher, Geoffrey continues to volunteer with watershed groups and teaches adults about stream health. His hobbies are hiking, baking, gardening and dancing (Scottish and Polish). His wife, Cecily, is an accomplished Scottish country dance teacher and tutor in her own right.



JUDI NICOLSON

Scottish fiddler Judi Nicolson is a consummate performer. Her dynamic fiddling, engaging stage presence, and deep understanding of Scotland's music has created a demand for her solo appearances, concerts and dances throughout the UK and America with a variety of groups.

Although classically trained from an early age, her passion was to play Traditional Scottish Fiddle Music. By the age of fifteen, she had won three major Open Scottish Fiddle Championships. Judi went on to play at various music venues throughout the UK both as a soloist and with some of the finest Scottish dance bands. Over the years, Judi has recorded numerous sessions for radio, appeared on television and in theatre. She has recorded 2 solo albums and 14 albums with various musicians/ bands over the years. She also published a book of her own compositions.

In 2008 Judi, husband Ian and their two children relocated to Katy, Texas where Judi continues to teach both classical and traditional Scottish fiddle, play for concerts, Scottish country dances, workshops, and balls.

KATHLEEN FRASER- COLLINS



Kathy was born in Ste. Anne de Prescott, Ontario, in a rural farming community near the Scottish settlement of Glengarry County. She received a B. Mus. from McGill University and a B. Ed. from University of Toronto and taught high school music from 1980 to 2009.

In 1975 she joined Bobby Brown and The Scottish Accent and spent 35 incredible years with the band recording and touring throughout North America and Scotland. Kathy and her husband Fred have recently formed the "Torridon Scottish Dance Band" and look forward to many more years of supporting Scottish country dancers through their beloved idiom! Kathy was recently inducted into the Glengarry Celtic Music Hall of Fame and is once again this year's Music Director for the 2016 TAC Summer School.
